REFLECTION
 Exploring Facts in the Apostles' Creed
Fact 2:and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
 Jesus Christ is the Son of God. More than 2,000 years ago He was born into this world as a baby. God himself became man. This is the biggest miracle of the world. The word "Christ" means the Anointed. In ancient Israel, when someone became king, he was anointed with holy oil. Calling Jesus the Anointed means: Jesus is "the Christ", the Saviour of the world, whom the people of Israel were waiting for.
 When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi he put this question to his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say he is John the Baptist, some Elijah, & others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." "But you," he said, "who do you say I am?" Then Simon Peter spoke up. "You are the Christ," he said, "the Son of the Living God."
 Pope Francis once was asked by an 8 year old girl: "What makes you happy in your work as pope?" He replied: "It makes me happy to be with people. If I cannot be with people, I spend most of my time with Jesus. I can't imagine myself alone."
 Mother Teresa: To me Jesus is my God, Jesus is my life, Jesus is my only love, Jesus is my all in all, Jesus is my everything. Jesus, I love you with my whole heart, with my whole being.
