**REFLECTION**  
**Question 8. How is knowledge of God passed on?** From the very beginning, the people of God have passed on their knowledge of God by storytelling; it was written down in the bible, it is celebrated in the liturgy & proclaimed by the Church. The people of God are a community where experiences with the living God are properly understood & passed on from generation to generation. Each Christian, who lives his life with God, has a story to tell. It's often the parents or grandparents who pass on the faith to their children & grandchildren. Sometimes it's friends, who tell you how they discovered God. When Christians talk about how God showed himself to them or how God led & healed them in their lives, they are giving a "testimony" of their own faith. A parent's or a friend's testimony of faith is often more important than wordy explanations. Children need the example of grown-ups, to hear of their personal experiences with God. Two mothers are talking about their child's preparation for the first Communion. "Mine hasn't got a clue! I asked him the names of the four evangelists and his answer was: Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar!" The other mother says: "Be glad that they be at least three!" The people of God, who God revealed himself to more and more over the millennia, can be imagined as a "Narrative Community". At the shepherds' campfires, at the well where they met to draw water, in the shadow of trees, in the temple – in every place holy stories about God were told. Not until later were they written down, becoming the Sacred Scriptures. Early Christians too lived from oral traditions before the gospels and other texts of the first Christians were written down. "Dear Jesus help us to spread your fragrance everywhere we go" St Teresa of Calcutta. *This is brought to you by the Diocesan Pastoral Council.*
